Commander's Commentary



Families and Friends,

The purpose of this newsletter is to reach out to you as a source of great strength for 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines. I also want to use this medium to further inform you of what is going on in 2/7. The more we can inform you and get you closer to your Marine or Sailor's military organization, the better we communicate and benefit from having you as a part of the team.

2/7 is training hard, and as I told the men recently, we are in the shoot for our deployment. Time is passing quickly and we have a responsibility not to squander it. In January, Battalion Landing Team 2/7 deploys to the Pacific to join the 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU.) To get ready, the battalion completed a combined arms fire and maneuver training program that began with our four-man teams and progressed to the battalion level. Now, the companies are on California's coast exercising our amphibious raid profiles and training to other special skills. The schedule for the deployment is solidifying and I must say that we will be busy. In addition to being forward deployed in the Pacific, based in Okinawa, and expeditionary on the ships of an Amphibious Ready Group, we will be deterring conflict and engaging in exercises with many partner nations. The Marines and Sailors of 2/7 will be the first 7th Marines battalion to deploy with a MEU and they will see regions and countries of this world that most only get the opportunity to read about and dream.

First and foremost I want to say that I am always available to help and am happy to do so. It is not my intention to create a barrier between myself and you, my customers. The Family Readiness Program, however, is designed to have volunteers comprised of spouses and other family members of unit Marines and Sailors. These volunteers assist me in assuring the best possible program for 2/7. We are looking to appoint more Assistants, so please contact me for more information.

Many of you have contacted me with a variety of questions and concerns, I truly appreciate this and hope to continue hearing from you. As an additional option, Family Readiness Assistants are also trained to provide information and referral services to spouses and caretakers of dependents. They can also answer general questions, and may even have some better answers than I can give about Company specific matters.

This program exists to provide you with support and resources, but is not intended to do things for you. We offer you the tools to conquer the challenges of military life, and will cheer you on as you attain successes along the way. Family Readiness Assistants are not a direct source of childcare, transportation, or emergency money, but they can make suggestions and give the contact information of agencies that do provide these and other services.

Family Readiness Assistants are not responsible to pass official information. That is something I do through e-mail and use of the Mass Communication Tool. We have been using this tool for several months and learn something new about it each time a message goes out. I appreciate your patience and especially your feedback. Salty Sally addresses some of these lessons learned, so check out her column on page 10.

You have choices when it comes to these messages. If you regularly receive e-mails from me, the information in these messages is also e-mailed. While you may request to have your phone number removed from the system, please keep in mind that it may become a short-fused source of getting out information around departures and homecomings.

I do my best to ensure that I have the most current information for contacting you, but please don't hesitate to reach out if you're not hearing from me. I would love to have e-mail addresses for as many spouses as possible, that is how I share a lot of information.

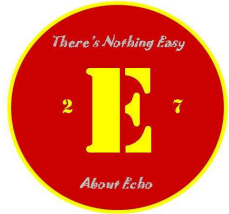

Dear Salty Sally,

What is with these phone calls? Can you explain how this works so that I can make it a useful tool for me?

Annoyed with the Ringing

Dear Annoyed,

When the FRO initiates a message using the Mass Communication Tool (MCT), she wants to be sure that everyone gets the message without being too intrusive. There is always an opportunity to confirm receipt of the message which should stop future attempts if the same message needs to later be resent to those who missed it. The longest delay option between each person's e-mail address(es) and phone number(s) is 3 minutes, but this should also work to stop any additional attempts the first time a message is sent. Instructions are given at the end to either press 1 to confirm receipt of the message, or there may be several choices if the FRO is looking for specific responses. E-mails with this tool work much in the same way. If you were to be checking your e-mail when a message comes in and you click the link to confirm receipt (or one of the polling options), your phone may not ring.

Another feature of this tool is that it should be leaving the message on your voicemail when possible. There are some new options coming available to prevent the actual message from recording, but giving a phone and pin number to retrieve the message. It should be understood that any PIN number given is unique to that message and is only active for 24 hours. It is likely that the FRO will opt for the actual message to be left on your voicemail.

On occasion, a message may be sent that the FRO wants to ensure is received by the adult individual intended to get the message. In such a case, the system is populated with a 4-digit PIN number unique to the member that would be required before the message is played. By default that PIN is the last 4 digits of the Servicemember's SSN. Anyone who is authorized into this system is welcome to give the FRO a different PIN number that they would remember. This system will NEVER be used to communicate sensitive, personal, classified, or casualty information.

This tool was built to improve communication and ensure that information is getting to all of the intended recipients. If at any time you are finding it to be a problem, please be sure to tell the FRO how you want to be contacted. Spouses are automatically eligible to receive communication through this tool, and additional family members can be included with the Servicemember's written consent. Please feel free to contact the FRO for more details.

While this is a personal decision for every family, I appreciate the question. Many spouses are unaware of the level of support that comes from their military base family. It's often unspoken and certainly not advertised, but you'd be surprised to learn how spouses come together to hold each other up during deployments. The experience reveals the tremendous strength of a military spouse and is certainly something to be proud of. On the other hand, sometimes a spouse really needs the kind of support she can get from her family back home. Keep in mind the added stress of two moves, changes in environment for children, and the fact that your home family may not understand the unique challenges that you face while your husband's away. You know best what will work for you, and each situation is different. Do be sure the FRO knows how to reach you if you move.
